The fresh opportunity to explore its lively cities and biodiverse rainforests has turned this Caribbean land into one of the most exciting destinations today. This wonderful trip opens all kinds of doors for you into the country – from innovative and artsy Medellín to languorous Cartagena. In between, you'll explore one of the legendary coffee plantations, visit colorful Guatapé, and discover virtually untouched nature in Tayrona National Park. You'll feel the pride and accomplishments of the Colombians, as you're introduced to them by your fulltime local guide. And you'll get that special traveler's pleasure that comes from being among the first to explore a country that's being added to more and more bucket lists every day.

DAY 1

MEDELLÍN

- Explore the "City of Eternal Spring" on a guided walk
- Ride the innovative Metrocable cars

Medellín is a fantastic introduction to the new Colombia. Entrepreneurial, lively and beautiful to boot it captures the country's revived spirit perfectly. Your introduction to the city comes on a walk with your fulltime local guide. You'll stroll the wide esplanades and classical colonial streetscapes. You'll also experience one of the most remarkable public transportation systems anywhere in the world. Think of the Metrocable as a subway in the sky with birds-eye views of the city. Every day, about 30,000 locals commute from district to district on gondolas with regular stops throughout the city. You'll go for a ride that offers panoramic vistas and a feel for the city's unique personality.

DAY 2

GUATAPÉ

- Marvel at the world's most colorful town
- Ascend La Piedra de Peñón

Just past the outskirts of Medellín, the pueblo of Guatapé is a town like nothing you've ever seen. Virtually every square inch of the houses and shops is covered in vivid paint of every color and decorative tiles known as zocalos. There's no rhyme or reason to it – just an incredibly happy energy that's hard to resist as you go explore with your guide. (Be sure your camera batteries are well-charged, because you will wear them down here.)

Guatapé's other unmistakable claim to fame is La Piedra de Peñón. This crazy pillar of granite thrusts up to unlikely heights from a hill over the town. What from a distance looks like a zipper up its side is actually a switchback staircase to the top. You'll have time to zig-zag to the top if you like for what many people say are the best views in Colombia. If street-level is more your style, you'll have time to explore and grab a beer or coffee at a sidewalk café.

After we return to Medellín, the rest of the day is yours to relax and enjoy dinner at one of the city's many great restaurants.

DAY 3

COFFEE FARM / SANTA MARTA

- Take a short flight to Santa Marta
- Walk the grounds of a coffee farm and enjoy a tasting

After breakfast, you'll make a short trip by air to Colombia's unspoiled northern coast on the Caribbean. The volcanic soil and mellow climate are ideal for agriculture from papayas and sugar cane to bananas and pineapples. But coffee is the real star of the show in this province, and you're in for a memorable firsthand look at the industry that touches most of us every day. You'll be welcomed to a 500-acre family coffee farm that's been in continuous operation since it was founded more than a century ago. Near the town of Minca, the farm also includes a nature reserve. You'll have time to wander the emerald landscape. You'll see how the beans are still grown and harvested in traditional style and be treated to a tasting. The property has streams and waterfalls, and the birdwatching is remarkable. After your days in the city, it's a fabulous introduction to quieter, tropical Colombia. Later, you'll check into your boutique hotel in the town of Santa Marta and enjoy the rest of the evening at your leisure.

DAY 4

TAYRONA NATIONAL PARK

- Take a Caribbean boat ride to a gold sand beach
- Go for a rainforest walk in the biodiverse jungle

This morning, you head for the bright blue Caribbean waters for a 40-minute boat ride that feels like it's taken you a million miles away. Tayrona National Park is a tropical paradise where the soaring Sierra Nevada de Santa Marta mountains meet the

sea. Gold sand beaches are fringed by palm trees. Hundreds of species of birds call the park home from blue-headed parrots to red-legged honeycreepers. Cotton-top tamarin monkeys are easy to spot and "Jesus Christ lizards," named for their ability to run on water, can be found amongst the rocks and trees alike.

Throughout this wonderful day in nature, you'll go for a guided jungle walk, stroll on the beaches and stretch out with a midday picnic.

DAY 5

CARTAGENA

- **Transfer from Santa Marta to Cartagena**
- **Join a local chef for a cooking instruction**

You'll start your morning with a beautiful coastal drive as you say goodbye to Santa Marta, and head to the bustling city of Cartagena.

You'll meet a local chef who will invite you to roll up your sleeves to prepare some of the local food specialties that you've been enjoying throughout the week. It's an easy-going instruction with interesting insights and a lot of fun (not to mention maybe something to sip on during the process).

DAY 6

LA BOQUILLA / CARTAGENA

- **Visit the students in La Boquilla and learn how to play the Afro-Colombian wild drums**
- **Take a guided walk in the Old Town, a UNESCO World Heritage site**

Today you'll visit La Boquilla, an afro-descendant fisher village, to meet the students of the Batambora Drum Workshop School. They are committed to rescuing and preserving the cultural traditions of the African heritage by playing traditional, handcrafted drums. You'll experience the sounds of typical rhythms of Afro-Colombian folk music such as Cumbia, Mapalé and Champeta, and have the opportunity to learn how to play these extraordinary drums.

After, you join a local guide on a walk in the Old Town, which is a UNESCO World Heritage site. Its narrow cobbled lanes invite you to explore. Vivid purple drapes of bougainvillea stream down from balconies. It's fascinating to see how the modern residents live so closely with centuries of the past.

Then you'll sit down to enjoy a lively farewell meal and reminisce about your week together.

DAY 7

DEPARTURE

- **Part company at your Cartagena hotel**

After breakfast, you'll transfer independently to the airport for the flight home. Or, if you like, arrange to spend extra days in Colombia to explore more on your own.
