The South of France You've Dreamed Of

Practice saying: "I'm vacationing in the south of France this year." Wonderful as it sounds, it's even better in real life. Think quiet country trails that wind through cherry orchards beneath rustic perched villages. In season, purple ribbons of lavender drape the hills. A friend (who also happens to be your local guide) insists on drizzling your warm bread with the award-winning olive oil she presses herself. You bask in the legendary sunlight, in the very landscapes Cezanne and van Gogh painted. The cultural landmarks are inspiring too – from the Roman's Pont du Gard aqueduct to serene Sénanque Abbey. And fair warning: on our walking tour in Provence you can get very used to lunches that end with ripe figs, goat cheese and a final sip of chilly rosé. This is Provence at its purest, and you will never forget it.

DAY 1

AVIGNON

- · Enjoy a guided walk of Avignon
- · See the Palais de Papes, where the Popes lived in the 14th and 15th centuries

From the moment you set foot in Avignon, there's no question you're in Provence. The Rhône churns past the city's walls. Dominating it all is the Palais des Papes, home of the breakaway papacy from 1316 until the 15th century. Today, its sweeping forecourt is sprinkled with lovely cafes and it's a stage for street performers who vie for your attention. We'll see it all—including the Pont d'Avignon, the bridge to nowhere—on a get-acquainted walk. And we'll rove, as well, through twisting streets where the region's trademark geraniums overflow the numerous window boxes.

This evening we gather for a special welcome dinner.

PONT-DU-GARD / UZÉS

· Follow a countryside path to the Pont-du-Gard aqueduct · Walk past old watermills in the Alzon River Valley

The breakfast table may include bowls of seasonal fruit. And preserves and warm croissants and blood-orange juice and... well, you get the picture. Eat hearty, because today begins with a beautiful countryside walk. At the end: the Pont-du-Gard, one of the surviving Roman wonders of the world. Remnant of an aqueduct system built over 2,000 years ago, the arched structure soars over the Gardon River. It's a classical treasure...and a monumental lesson in the vivid history of the region. Late in the morning, we make a short journey to the charming village of Uzés for lunch at a café. You'll have the option of staying on a little longer to explore and shop, or you can choose from two walks into the Alzon River valley to see the old watermill houses. We return to our country hotel in the late afternoon where you may want to relax by the pool or enjoy a pastis before dinner. A few sips of the potent yellow aperitif and you may just start seeing Provence like a certain one-eared painter who also favored the drink.

DAY 3

CHÂTEAUNEUF-DU-PAPE

- Explore the Roman Theater in Orange
- · Savor a Châteauneuf-du-Pape wine-tasting
- · Cook with Michelin-starred chef Alain Nicolet

After a classic provençal breakfast, we'll take a leisurely amble through the region's vineyards, before our morning's destination: the Roman theater of Orange, another of the best-preserved structures dating back to ancient times.

After a morning spent among the vineyards, we think a visit to one of our favorite wineries is in order. Even if you're not a certified wine-lover, you'll recognize Châteauneuf-du-Pape as one of France's premiere wine regions. Because our group is small, we're able to enter the cellars for a tasting (where other groups are not permitted). We also see the ruins of Château des Papes, the summer retreat of the Popes. From the remaining walls, we get a magnificent view across the Rhône valley.

Our afternoon is the culinary pinnacle of the week as we join Michelin-starred Chef Alain Nicolet for an amazing cooking instruction. He will share the secrets of cuisine à la Provençale, the complex and savory flavors built on fresh herbs, peppery olive oil, garlic, and tomatoes. With the kitchen full of fresh Mediterranean produce, we roll up our sleeves, fire up the stove, and get a memorable hands-on lesson from a true master. Appetites stoked by the aromas of Chef Alain's kitchen, we sit down to the spectacular dinner we helped prepare.

DAY 4

ALPILLES / ST. RÉMY

- · Taste the olive oil at our friend's mill
- · Shopping the village market in Saint-Rémy

· Visit a 12th-century cloister once inhabited by Van Gogh

Today we cross over to the Rhône's opposite banks into the scenic heart of Provence, beginning with the Alpilles, named for the enchanting chain of small limestone mountains dotted with villages, cypress trees, and sunflowers. Along the way, we stop at Moulin Barbentane, the traditional olive mill that's a labor of love for our friends Isabelle and Jean. Their pressings have won international awards, and they tell us about the art of raising and selecting olives before treating us to a tasting of their oils.

Next we'll visit the weekly market in Saint-Rémy-de-Provence, featuring fresh cheeses, fruits, wines, and other local products, perfect to fill our basket for the midday picnic that awaits. From Saint Rémy we'll walk (or board our minicoach, if you'd prefer) to Les Baux. Our early afternoon walk captures this gorgeous medieval village perched on a rocky crest jutting up abruptly from the plains below, and is the perfect view to accompany our authentic *pique-nique*.

As we venture into a scenic rock quarry, we'll take in the town's monumental sound and light show, Carrières de Lumières, where projected images of famous artwork are dramatically cast upon vast stretches of natural rock. When our eyes adjust back to the light of day, we'll make our way to St. Paul de Mausole. Near St. Rémy lies this 12th-century cloister where Van Gogh spent the last year of his life. Using reproductions, the caretakers make it easy to see how much of the local landscape appeared in his paintings.

We end the day at our luxurious hotel nestled in a 19th-century townhouse in the heart of St. Rémy, as we will for the remainder of our week together. This evening you may choose to swim, relax at the hotel or venture into St. Rémy for some shopping and dinner.

DAY 5

LUBERON / GORDES

- · Walk to Sénangue Abbey, surrounded by lavender
- · Explore the enigmatic stone hut Bories

After a relaxing start to the day over croissants and café au lait, we enter the Luberon, which you may recognize from Peter Mayle's book "A Year in Provence" and visit the village of Roussillon. It's a startling sight, constructed as it was from 17 different shades of red sandstone. We have a short, enjoyable walk through the ochre quarries, then depart for Sénanque Abbey, set in an isolated valley surrounded by a field of lavender and oaks. One of only three Cistercian monasteries in Provence, it is still occupied by the monks.

After lunch and a visit, we take an easy stroll to Gordes. Our trail winds past one of the trademark structures of Provence, a borie. Bories are amazing corbelled vaults of flagstones, stacked high with no mortar to secure them. Similar to Neolithic examples found elsewhere in Europe, these are believed to be from the 18th or 19th century. They're remotely located and some experts speculate that they were built to escape the plague.

If you'd prefer to skip this walk, you can ride ahead in the van and arrive in Gordes early, with time to go people-watching and shopping. We return to our hotel in the late afternoon to relax before our festive farewell dinner together.

DAY 6

AIX-EN-PROVENCE

· Follow Cézanne's footsteps · Bid farewell to Provence

From farm country, we venture to the elegant university town of Aix-en-Provence, home of Cézanne. A guided walk retraces many of the artist's footsteps, and includes the beautiful Cours Mirabeau Boulevard with its outdoor cafes, sculpted plane trees and fountains, as well as the flower and vegetable market. At the end of our visit, we'll deliver you directly to the city's TGV rail station.

Built as a marquis' private residence in 1580, this 5-star property has been a hotel since 1799. The rooms are quiet and lovely, and you are steps from the Palais des Papes and the lively street life of Avignon.

This 18th-century château has views of Mont Ventoux and the Luberon. Renovated to reflect its original splendor, it offers a garden where you can relax under a 400-year-old cedar tree, or cool off on a warm Provençal afternoon with a dip in the pool.

Le Saint-Rémy

At the foot of the Alpilles and in the heart of the historic village of Saint-Rémy-de-Provence, this 5-star hotel is nestled in a 19th-century townhouse and features a spa, outdoor pool, and a restaurant with garden and terrace.
