DAY 1 »

Killarney

Your Irish adventure begins in Killarney, a picturesque town cradled by the majestic MacGillycuddy's Reeks Mountain range, verdant landscapes, and the sparkling waters of the lakes. Immerse yourself in this emerald oasis as you set out on a countryside path in Killarney National Park with your expert local guide. Wander through ancient woodlands to the magnificent Torc Waterfall, where a 65-foot cascade tumbles over moss-covered rocks in an enchanting, wooded glen. Approach the base of this natural wonder, tucked away like a hidden oasis, and let the soothing sounds of the falls envelop you.

Then, step back in time at the 15th-century Ross Castle, an impressive stronghold that once guarded an Irish chieftain. As you wander the rooms adorned with 16th and 17th-century furnishings, your guide regales you with tales of the castle's storied past, while the serene views of Lough Leane provide a picturesque backdrop. Savor a delightful treat at the shop of local artisans who have mastered the art of crafting world-renowned ice cream, trying to pronounce the delightful Gaelic names of the flavors before indulging in the decadent homemade desserts.

After dinner in Killarney town, you can retire to your hotel or join your guide for a visit to a local pub, where the lively atmosphere and traditional music offer a true taste of Irish culture.

DAY 2 »

Killarney's Lakes & Cottages

Today's explorations begin at Kate Kearney's Cottage, a historic pub named after the colorful character who sold her illegal homebrew to thirsty travelers in the 1800s. Stepping into this quaint cottage is like entering a piece of Irish folklore. A horse-drawn jaunting car transports you to the start of a scenic trail, where you embark on foot, winding through the breathtaking Gap of Dunloe. This spectacular valley is a tapestry of lakes, streams, meadows, waterfalls, and the famed Wishing Bridge, all nestled beneath the towering peaks of MacGillycuddy's Reeks, Ireland's tallest mountain range.

Pause for lunch at Lord Brandon's Cottage, a charming respite in the heart of this natural wonder. Refreshed, approach the shimmering shores of the fabled Killarney Lakes for a leisurely cruise aboard a traditional wooden skiff. As your captain navigates the waters, you'll follow in the footsteps of generations of fishermen and adventurers who have explored these lakes throughout the centuries. Listen to vivid tales from your boatmen, who share insights into the local Irish heritage and treasured fables, while keeping an eye out for the swans, herons, and even red deer that call these shores home.

DAY 3 »

Ring of Kerry

Begin your day with a morning walk along the quiet countryside paths, before journeying to a nearby sheep station. Here, you'll meet a family who has proudly bred a flock of nearly 1,000 mountain sheep for almost 150 years. Experience their rural life firsthand as you stroll through the fields, meeting their prized sheepdogs and gaining insights into their time-honored traditions.

A scenic ferry ride transports you to Valentia Island, where you'll ascend to the Skellig Interpretive Centre. Perched on the cinematic southwest coast, these rugged islands were once home to a small group of men seeking religious solitude and isolation, earning the nickname "the island on the edge of the world." Immerse yourself in the magic and mystery of these famous rocks, visiting the iconic lighthouse and keeping a watchful eye for the puffins and gannets that call this remote outpost home.

After lunch, embark on 'The Mass Path,' a historic beach walk that follows the shoreline of Derrynane Bay, also known as the 'pilgrim path.' Your journey culminates at Derrynane House, the ancestral home of Daniel O'Connell, a lawyer, politician, and statesman who was one of the great figures in modern Irish history. Later, return to the mainland to relax at your hotel before indulging in a dinner of local specialties.

DAY 4 »

Kenmare

Begin your day with a visit to our friend Benoit, a Frenchman who migrated to Ireland and brought with him a passion for crafting award-winning chocolates. Led by your own personal Willy Wonka, wander through his factory (formerly a tiny country post office), learning the secrets behind his creations and savoring some of his favorite confections. Then, roll up your sleeves for an 'only with Classic Journeys' chocolate-making lesson alongside the expert himself.

Afterward, stretch your legs on a walk to a local farm, where you'll gain an insider's look at rural life in the Irish countryside. Stroll the grounds with your hosts, who will share their treasured traditions of peat cutting and moonshine making. Learn how potatoes or barley are first fermented with sugar and baker's yeast in large barrels, then heated over an open fire to distill a potent whiskey called "poitin."

Following lunch, an afternoon walk leads you to a fascinating stone circle. Built during the Bronze Age, this 3,000-year-old monument is composed of 15 boulders, believed to be used for burial or ceremonial purposes, though its true purpose remains a mystery. With your guide, pitch your own theory for the construction and purpose of this site, the largest in County Kerry. From there, stroll through the quaint Kenmare town before returning to your hotel for the evening.

DAY 5 »

Beara Peninsula

Begin your day at your hotel's beautiful estate with a guided hawk walk and falconry session. Witness the unique bond formed between these impressive birds of prey and their handlers, and even have the opportunity to handle and fly these majestic creatures yourself.

Then, venture to the Beara Peninsula on Ireland's incredibly scenic southwest coast. Set out on a nature walk in Gleninchaquin Park, where breathtaking landscapes unfold at every turn. Explore on foot, past streams with log bridges, through rock passages, along wooded glens, and across picturesque meadows. Soak in the views overlooking lakes and at the base of waterfalls, while your guide shares insights into the local flora and fauna. The tranquility of the park makes it a haven for wildlife, including red deer, foxes, and the occasional Irish hare darting across the grasslands. Keep an eye to the skies for the abundance of birdlife, including robins, thrushes, and finches, that call this natural oasis home.

Pause for a lunch of local specialties (fish and chips, perhaps?) before a guided exploration of the Gardens of Derreen. This magnificent 19th-century woodland garden is a stunning estate that was once home to the Marquis of Lansdowne, a descendant of Kenmare's founder Sir William Petty. Now, it boasts a luxuriant display of rhododendrons, camellias, tree ferns, and many colorful semi-tropical shrubs and verdant trees that flourish all around you. Take your time strolling through the gardens, admiring the views of the surrounding sea and mountains.

DAY 6 »

Muckross House + Abbey

Following breakfast, visit Muckross House, a magnificent mansion that offers a glimpse into Ireland's Victorian past through its manicured gardens and expansive lawns. The elegant estate, with its opulent rooms, also plays host to a community of craft workers who demonstrate skills such as weaving, bookbinding, and pottery making. One of the few remaining indigenous oak woods of Ireland, dating back two centuries, surrounds the property. Stroll through the estate's formal gardens and along a forest footpath that winds through the grand oak woods, bringing you to the remarkably preserved Muckross Abbey. Get up close to these 15th-century ruins and take in the commanding views of Lough Leane, a serene lake that mirrors the surrounding beauty.

This afternoon your Irish walking adventure comes to a close as you part company at the Killarney rail station.
